There are a number of potentially rewarding digs in this mine, which should be considered on our next visit. Other members completed the through trip to Ramp Ghyll Mine down the connecting shaft to Jake Irwin's Crosscut. This route was repeated on Sunday by most of the other members attending the meet. Familiar parts of Ramp Ghyll Mine were visited by all members whilst a few more walked across the moors to examine some deep shafts earmarked for further exploration in the future.
